# 1. ERASMUS POLICY STATEMENT (EPS)

# Participation in Erasmus+

**IES Alfonso X el Sabio in Murcia** is the third oldest high school in Spain, founded on October 5, 1837, making it 187 years old. This gives us the privilege of being part of an educational institution with extensive experience and a strong teaching tradition.

At our school, students can pursue Compulsory Secondary Education (ESO), Baccalaureate programs, including the Research and International tracks, and Vocational Training in the field of Information Technology and Communications. We offer Basic Vocational Training in Office IT, the Intermediate Vocational Training in Microcomputer Systems and Networks, and the Higher Vocational Education in Multiplatform Application Development, available both on-site and online.

It is worth highlighting that Secondary and Baccalaureate education is delivered through bilingual models in **English**, **French**, and **German**. As such, we have departments dedicated to these three languages, fostering a richer and more diverse educational experience.

During the 2022/23 academic year, the school participated in its first **Erasmus+ mobility program** through the project "Training for Europe." This initiative focused on staff mobility, aiming to enhance teachers' skills related to designing European projects. The program targeted teachers of Secondary and Baccalaureate education.

Since the 2022/23 academic year, both VET teachers and students have benefitted from Erasmus+ scholarships organized by the **Department of Education and Vocational Training of the Region of Murcia**. Specifically, five students from the Basic Vocational Training program in Office IT traveled to **Prague**, accompanied by a teacher, for two weeks of practical training. Under the same program, another teacher participated in a one-week **Job Shadowing** in **Croatia**.

However, students and teachers engaged in **Higher Education Studies** have not yet had the opportunity to undertake mobility experiences for internships in EU countries through Erasmus+ programs. Thus, we have decided to launch this project.

To complete their vocational studies, students must undertake an internship period in a company. We plan for our **High Education Studies** students to complete this internship in a European Union country, fostering **internationalization**, enhancing students' **employability**, and providing them with opportunities to better understand **European culture and values**.

We also aim to enable a group of Vocational Training teachers to participate in **Job Shadowing** or attend training courses relevant to our field, such as topics related to **Artificial Intelligence** or **ICTs**, which are closely linked to our professional area.

Additionally, we intend to host European teachers who wish to learn about our facilities and teaching methods, connect them with companies in our field, and even invite them to visit the **University of Murcia**, a key partner of our school, as several teachers teach in both institutions.

#### **Benefits for Students and Teachers**

For students, participating in this program will offer a valuable **international experience** to include on their CVs, exposure to new work environments, and opportunities to experience different business cultures and methodologies. They will also significantly enhance their **language skills**, with intensive practice and technical vocabulary acquisition. This, in turn, will foster personal growth, greater autonomy, and maturity, while increasing their self-confidence. Students will also gain cultural insights, inspiring others through shared experiences.

For teachers, the Erasmus+ program will provide opportunities to observe and learn directly from European colleagues, gaining exposure to **innovative teaching methodologies** and updating their **technical and pedagogical skills**. They, too, will improve their **language** and **intercultural competencies**, while discovering new educational tools and digital resources to enhance teaching practices. These experiences will benefit the entire institution through the dissemination of acquired knowledge and help **internationalize** the school. Teachers will also have the chance to compare curricula and adapt teaching practices to the **key competencies** defined by the European Union, such as **digitalization**, **entrepreneurship**, and **sustainability**.

- Encourage the creation of international professional networks for the exchange of best practices and the design of joint projects that enrich our educational offerings.
- Modernize and strengthen curricula by integrating innovative pedagogical and technological approaches identified in other European countries.
- Enhance the school's reputation as a leader in international vocational training in the field of IT.

#### **Indicators**

### Student Profile:

Candidates must be in their second year, have passed the required modules, demonstrate maturity and a strong academic record, possess proficiency in English or the language of the destination, and submit a CV in the Europass format. In cases of financial dependence, parental consent is required.

# **Selection Process:**

Every October, the call for applications is published with clear deadlines:

- Informative sessions: Second week of October.
- Call publication: Third week of October.
- Application submissions: During the first week of November.
- Interviews and document submission: Second week of November.
- Provisional results: Third week of November.
- Final results: Fourth week of November.
- Planning meeting: December.

This process ensures transparency and fairness in the selection of participants, thereby promoting the success of the program.
